DIRECTOR'S NOTE

'Things I Know to be True' is a play about family, about love and how we can hurt the ones we love the most. I first read the play in 2018 when I was studying at the VCA and can still recall my emotional response to the work to this very day. I was an emotional mess. I felt like I knew this family, their daily lives reminded me of my own family, Fran and Bob made me think of my parents and their own dream and aspirations, and the many sacrifices they've made for me. I think this could be true for many families, and the reason this play strongly resonates with parents, children and siblings alike. Andrew Bovell has crafted a play that is masterfully structured with complex characters that we become invested in from the very opening moment:

PIP: It's late. BEN: Past midnight. PIP: And the phone starts to ring.

This set up is not only a suspenseful cliff hanger, but it also hints that the form of this work allows characters to narrate the action and exist in a liminal space. Andrew's play provides a rich tapestry for us to explore both the domesticity as well as the most inner thoughts of the Price family, inviting us to witness their lives with such intimacy and authenticity that we forget we are in a theatre. I think it's magic.

My approach to directing is embedded in collaboration, and I want to acknowledge that what you experience onstage is only the tip of the iceberg of many, many conversations, ideas, trials and errors, editing, debating, questioning and supporting each other throughout the process. It has been a privilege to share this journey with the cast and creative team with openness and trust that is integral to making a work of this magnitude.
